

- I was honored to have an article of mine included as the leading article in the Spring issue of the Anglican Journal of Theology in Aotearoa and Oceania, which was published this month. The editor writes, "The first article 'The Sensual Gospel of St John the Evangelist' traces a theological whakapapa of incarnational spirituality that is rooted in the Gospel of John, one that rejects the artificial separation of the natural world and the spiritual. The author, Daniel London, is an Episcopal priest and scholar, who spent a portion of his research leave this year at St John's College. He shares the fruit of that research with us through the lens of reception history. That is, drawing on the writings of Celtic and Anglican scholars over several generations. Out of that he encourages us to celebrate the gift of enfleshment and appreciate those spiritual practices that 'help us connect to the earth and our own human flesh, through which God chose to make his glory known.'"
- On December 14, I attended a daylong working retreat with the Worship Planning Committee for the Revival, *Fearless Faith: Planting Love & Harvesting Hope*. We met with musicians Lacey Brown (from Church of the Apostles in Seattle), Quincy Dover (NY) and Alejandro Thanh Montes (Houston TX) who are planning to lead music at the Revival. The three of them led music at the EYE (Episcopal Youth Event) in Maryland last summer. The Revival will take place in Roseville on **April 26 & 27**. Christ Church is slated to serve as the remote location for a livestream of the Revival.
